In this guide, we'll help you decide if a Wheelchair Accessible Vehicle (WAV) is right for you.

What is a WAV?

It's a vehicle that's been converted so you can travel as a passenger or driver while you stay in your wheelchair. They're ideal for most people who use a wheelchair.

If you're not able to transfer from your wheelchair to a standard car seat, a WAV could be a good option for you.

Most WAVs position you behind the front seats or near the back. Some WAVs let you sit next to the driver. You can learn more at **motability.co.uk/wavs**.

Are you eligible?

You can join the Scheme if you receive a higher rate mobility allowance and have at least 12 months left. If you're a parent or guardian of a child aged three or over, you can also apply on their behalf.

You choose who drives

You can insure up to three drivers on your WAV. So even if you do not drive, you can still take advantage of the Scheme.

Types of WAV on the Scheme

Our WAVs come in different sizes: small, medium-small, mediumlarge, and large. There are also lots of different types of WAVs available on the Scheme. Here's a quick overview. You can visit **motability.co.uk/wavs** and use our online tool to learn more.

Passenger WAVs

You can ride in these or store your wheelchair. They're the most common and popular type of WAV on the Scheme. You'll usually get in using a ramp or lift, then someone else will need to secure your wheelchair with tie-downs.

Nearly New WAVs

These are WAVs people have given back after they've ended their lease early. They'll be up to four years old, in good condition, and cost less. We can still give you a demonstration at your home and adapt them to suit your needs.

Your lease on these will be three years instead of five. Check with your supplier to see if they have a Nearly New WAV that suits your needs. It might mean you need to compromise on something less important, like colour. Visit **motability.co.uk/nearlynew** for more.



Drive From Wheelchair WAVs

These make it possible to stay in your wheelchair while you drive. They're large vehicles that are specially adapted for you. You might also hear these called Independent Driving Solutions.

They cost more than passenger WAVs and take time to make, but they offer great independence. Visit **motability.co.uk/dfw** for more.

Adaptations might suit you best

If you can transfer out of your wheelchair, a standard car fitted with adaptations could be a better option for you.

We have a range of adaptations to help you drive, get in and out, or store your equipment. You can add many adaptations at the start of your lease at no extra cost.

We work with installers who can guide you on the different types of adaptations that might help you. You can find one close to you at **motability.co.uk/adaptations**.

How you get in and out of your WAV

You can choose to access your WAV from the rear or the side. Think about how you'll use and park your WAV before you decide.

Ramps

These make it simple to get your wheelchair into your WAV. You can choose a built-in manual or automatic ramp.

If you go for a side-access ramp, it can be more convenient. It can also be steep, so you might need extra help.

Talk to your WAV supplier about your ramp options to make sure you get the right one for you.

Lifts

Some large WAVs have a lift instead of a ramp. This means as long as you can secure yourself, you can get in and out by yourself, without help, and even drive it alone. They cost more and add extra weight to your WAV.





Travelling in comfort and safety

Travelling in a wheelchair in a WAV will feel different to a standard car seat. Most people get used to this over time.

Seating inside your WAV

The space inside your WAV is important. You'll need room for your passengers and the things you travel with regularly, such as shopping or mobility aids.

Most WAVs position the wheelchair passenger behind the front seats or towards the back of the vehicle. Some WAVs let the wheelchair passenger sit beside the driver.

There are lots of seating layouts available, depending on the size of WAV and what you need. Your WAV supplier will talk through your options.

Safety and space

Most WAVs have four belts that attach to the front and rear of the wheelchair, to lock it in place. The front belts are adjustable and usually self-lock. Everyone helping you get in and out your WAV should test this out during your demonstration.

There's also a three-point seatbelt for the wheelchair passenger to use. If your wheelchair weighs over 140kg, not all restraint systems will be suitable. Your WAV supplier will explain your options.

Helpful tips

- Check your position in the WAV does not make it difficult to see out of the windows or hear passengers
- Does the layout let people get to your wheelchair user during journeys?
- You can ask for extra seats on some WAVs. These can be smaller than a standard seat and might not be suitable for long journeys or for baby or child seats
- You'll get air conditioning in all WAVs. If you're sensitive to temperature, you might need extra heating
- If your carer has limited hand mobility or dexterity, some tie-downs might be easier to use than others

Once you're ready, here's how to join the Scheme in three easy steps.

Step one. Choose your new WAV

Step two. Have a demonstration

Our WAV suppliers will bring the WAV you like to your home, with no pressure to lease it. They'll show you around and let you test drive it, so you can feel confident it's right for you.

If you will not be driving yourself, a family member, friend or carer can take the test drive for you.

First, choose one of our WAV suppliers. They all offer a nationwide service and are trained specialists. They can talk to you about your needs and recommend solutions. You can find our suppliers at **motability.co.uk/findadealer**.

Speak to a few suppliers and test drive a few WAVs before you make your mind up. It's important you understand what each supplier includes, as this might differ.

They'll build up a picture of your needs over the phone first, to make sure they bring the most appropriate WAV for you.

During your demonstration, remember to:

- Visit places and roads you'd regularly use
- Try your luggage and equipment
- Practise loading and getting in and out
- Ask about travel costs, based on the fuel you choose
- Think about whether your needs might change in the future





Trying out a WAV is the only way to check it meets all your needs, both as a wheelchair user and for the person driving it. A home demonstration costs nothing. You can have as many as you like, from as many suppliers as you like, and take a long as you need.

Visit **motability.co.uk/wavsearch** to start your search now. Once you've found the WAV that best suits your needs, just order it with your supplier.
